

Convention Ratification Ballot

The Ratification Ballot on constitution amendments approved by the 2013 Convention is a graded report. It is important for your chapter to voice its vote.

The deadline is April 1, 2014, for TBP chapters to either scan a signed copy of the ballot and email it to tbp@tbp.org or mail the signed ballot (postmark April 1). See the summary sheet on the "Constitution Amendments Approved by the Convention but Subject to Ratification by the Chapters" for Convention minutes references, and follow the "Instructions for Ratification Balloting" on page 3 for explanation of quorum requirements and active status. There are four amendments to be voted on:

1. Amend Constitution Art. III, Sec. 2 (h) and Bylaws I, Sec. 1.05; III, Sec. 3.01 (e) (11); V, Secs. 5.03 (e) (1) and 5.04 (c) to eliminate the separate Convention assessment and include it in the initiation fees.
2. Amend Constitution Art. III, Sec. 2 to include the Director of Alumni Affairs as a voting member of Convention.
3. Amend Constitution Art. IV, Sec. 2 (g) (5) and Bylaw III, Sec. 3.07 to eliminate the duplicate description of the duties of the Director of Alumni Affairs.
4. Amend Constitution Art. VI, Sec. 6 and Bylaw V, Sec. 5.03 (f) to eliminate the collegiate chapter office of Cataloger.

MindSET Updates from the 2013 Convention

More than fourteen Tau Beta Pi student representatives, led by District Directors Joe Burnett, CA U '04, and Lauren Swett, ME A '04, discussed the state of the MindSET program and important aspects that required review. Two co-chairs were elected and the committee was divided into two teams to better focus efforts. The following is a brief summary of the actions and recommendations put forth by co-chairs Wouter de Wet, TN A 2014, and Sankha Ghatak, NY H 2014, to the Convention delegation.

The MindSET committee at Convention discussed the refinement and distribution of information for chapters that are establishing new MindSET projects, or may be struggling to establish a healthy, ongoing program. By reviewing the methods of successful TBP chapters, the committee provided suggestions and solutions to chapters of all sizes and resource availability with regards to the 10-step guide to chapter implementation.

MindSET Program



The details and suggestions from the committee for additions to material available to chapters has been updated and made available on the MindSET website, which will also undergo organizational changes as determined by the committee.

An important effort was also made in revising and clarifying several vague elements of the Mindset Grant request application. The goal of the committee was to make it easier for Tau Beta Pi to get the information it wants from its chapters, and in turn aid the chapters in organizing their event. All suggested changes were geared towards making it

easier for inexperienced TBP chapters to start a MindSET project and receive prompt and sufficient funding.

It was also recommend that the council arrange for the presence of the K-12 MindSET ad hoc committee at the 2014 Convention to continue this work as well as discuss the future possibility of MindSET facilitators (similar to the Tau Beta Pi Engineering Futures program currently in place) to help struggling chapters get their programs on their feet and ensure the continuity and growth of existing programs.

Tau Beta Pi Outstanding Advisor

Each year Tau Beta Pi recognizes an Outstanding Advisor at Convention for their superior performance and dedication to serving collegiate engineering students and supporting the Association. Any chapter may nominate one Advisor for the award. The winner will receive a \$1,000 cash prize, a plaque, publicity in *The Bent* and on the website, and \$1,000 to the dean's discretionary fund.

The Tau Beta Pi Outstanding Advisor Program has been recognizing outstanding performance among chapter advisors since 1994. Chapters must submit a letter of nomination; other information on how to proceed is found in the *President's Book* (pp. C-38) and on [the website](#). If your advisor is an extraordinary leader for your chapter, submit a nomination by email to HQ by April 1— to the attention of Secretary Treasurer Gomulinski.

Engineering Futures Sessions

BRING THE TAU BETA PI ENGINEERING FUTURES PROGRAM to your campus. There is no cost to your chapter; just provide the students! Contact Sherry King (sherry@tbp.org) about hosting an EF session.

The program won the American Society of Engineering Education Corporate Member Council's 2007 Excellence in Engineering Education Collaboration Award. This recognition validated two decades of effort by facilitators since 1988. Approximately 3,100 engineering students annually participate in 234 sessions to learn interpersonal skills. Scholarships of \$1,000 or \$2,000 are given to members on the competitive bases of scholarship, campus leadership and service, and promise of contributions to the engineering profession, with consideration given to economic need and academic commitment.



At the 2012 Convention, the body voted to adopt a three-year trial procedure for Convention Site selection that allows chapters to submit a request to host and requires at least three proposals to be considered each year. The Convention site will be selected only two years in advance.

If your chapter is interested in hosting the 2016 Convention, please submit your request by email with the following items to the Executive Director by June 1:

- Letter of invitation from chapter expressing an interest in hosting the Convention (1 page)
- Letter from your Dean supporting the bid (1 page)
- Biographical sheet on your chapter, including its activities, total membership, etc. (1 page)
- Information on host city, including closest airport with number of flights per day and potential hotels (need at least 275 hotel rooms, one room large enough for 500 people, and 17 breakout rooms).
