Held in Albuquerque, New Mexico, on October 30 – November 1, the 119th Convention of Tau Beta Pi was hosted by the New Mexico Beta Chapter at the University of New Mexico and the Albuquerque Alumni Chapter. Students held formal debates on the Convention floor and led the work of standing committees such as Constitution & Bylaws, Financial Affairs, Awards, Convention Site, and Resolutions. Nineteen collegiate chapters received Chapter Excellence Awards, which utilize performance in areas of initiation, membership, operations, finances, convention, programs, and advisors. 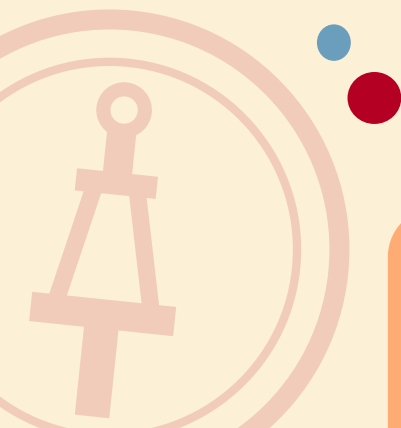
