**Outstanding Advisor
Award**



The purpose of the Outstanding Advisor Award is to recognize superior performance among the Tau Beta Pi chapter Advisors. After a three-year trial, the 1996 Convention established the award to be given annually.

Any chapter may nominate one Advisor for the award. A nominating committee from the chapter, excluding but in consultation with the Advisor-nominee, should email the nomination material to the Executive Director by April 1.

Include the following items:

- 1) *A letter of nomination from the chapter which specifies the manner in which the nominee has fulfilled, with sustained excellence (for a minimum of three years), the role of Advisor, consistent with the mission of TBPi. The letter must be signed by each member of the Advisory Board, except the nominee.*
- 2) *A letter from the dean of engineering supporting the nomination and addressing the closeness of the chapter's Advisor-nominee with the administration on behalf of the chapter.*

- **Deadline is April 1**
- **Email nomination material to tbp@tbp.org.**
- **The honoree will receive a plaque, a \$1,000 cash prize, \$1,000 to the dean's discretionary fund, travel expenses to attend the annual Convention, and publicity in *The Bent***
- **A committee of engineering deans, as appointed by the TBPi Executive Council will select the winner**
- **Winner will be announced in July**

3) *A letter from a District Director supporting the nomination and addressing the closeness of the interaction of the chapter's nominee with the District Program.*

4) *A one- to three-page description of the contributions of the nominee to the chapter. This should address the manner in which the Advisor fulfills the position in support of the TBPi mission.*

It is also useful to include information on the accomplishments (awards, activities, etc.) of the chapter under the guidance of the nominee.

5) *A résumé, not to exceed three pages, of the Advisor-nominee.*

The award cannot be received more often than once every four years.
