



THE Tau Beta Pi Scholarship Program



This is the 22nd year that Tau Beta Pi will award and recognize members with funds in support of their senior year of undergraduate study. Last year, 289 scholarships were awarded from 628 applicants.

Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic achievement, extracurricular activities, and the promise of substantial contributions to the engineering profession. Strong faculty recommendations are an integral component to the application.

Applicants are welcome from members or candidates for membership who will be initiated by June 1. Recipients must be full-time undergraduate engineering students during 2020-21. Full-time students, graduating in the fall semester, are eligible for partial scholarships.

- Application **available** online beginning January 31.
- **Deadline is 11:59 P.M. EST April 1.**
- **Scholarships are restricted to initiated members planning to return to school for at least one semester of full-time undergraduate study.**
- **Each full-year award is \$2,000. Partial scholarships will be awarded \$1,000.**

Scholarships will be announced in early July. Scholars will receive \$2,000 payable in two

equal payments in mid-September and mid-January.

Scholars returning for one semester will receive a single payment of \$1,000 in mid-September.
