2. Project Evaluation

i. General Description

The Lunar New Year Celebration was a collaboration with various engineering organizations across the University of Alabama in Huntsville including Tau Beta Pi, the National Society of Black Engineers, the Society of Asian Scientists and Engineers, the Society of Women Engineers, and the Society of Hispanic Engineers. This event was created in order to bring awareness and celebrate the Lunar New Year with traditional Chinese foods and crafts such as dumplings, donuts, and fortune cookies with traditional red envelopes activities. Each organization hosted a table with a different craft or food item and Tau Beta Pi supplied traditional Chinese candies that were purchased at an Asian market in Huntsville, Alabama and donuts that were bought at Rice Box. Our activity was a scavenger hunt that allowed for a deeper understanding of Lunar New Year and Chinese culture itself.

ii. Purpose and Relationship to Objectives of Tau Beta Pi

One of Tau Beta Pi's objectives is to advance collaborative member engagement and this event allowed for that by incorporating students in the setup and participation of the event as well as by incorporating education of a celebration not many students have participated in before. This event brought students who come from backgrounds that do celebrate Lunar New Year and gave them more of a voice in the creation of this event which promoted further participation of active members.

iii. **Organization and Administration**

Tau Beta Pi worked with the National Society of Black Engineers, the Society of Asian Scientists and Engineers, the Society of Women Engineers, and the Society of Hispanic Engineers. Because of the large amount of organizations included in this event, each group focused on their own tables and not of the event as a whole. Tau Beta Pi was led by Cameron Gallups and Elizabeth Dawson who met with the other organizations through meetings prior to the event itself and Abigail Williamson worked with Cameron to purchase appropriate items for the event such as decorations, traditional Chinese candies at Asian markets and Chinese donuts bought from Rice Box.

The only thing that we wish could be better in the future is to get better chapter specific attendance, however this was prior to our first meeting of the semester, so the low attendance is understandable.


