2. Project Evaluation

i. General Description

This is a volunteering event with GALS LV, an all-girls charter middle school located near UNLV. Communication with supervisors at the middle school has given our chapter the opportunity to introduce students to various engineering concepts by constructing solar-powered cars. Every Friday, students were given a presentation on concepts like the engineering design process, chassis/wheels/bearings, solar power, transmission, and car body construction. After each presentation, students were given time to construct the solar-powered cars in teams of 2-4 students. After the final session, students were able to race their cars against other teams in their session. In addition, a MindSET Grant was applied for and received to help fund this project.

ii. Purpose and Relationship to Objectives of Tau Beta Pi

By having members of our chapter volunteer with GALS LV, we were able to contribute to the surrounding community by engaging students with engineering concepts and an engineering project. Students were given the opportunity to develop their interests in engineering to foster the education of potential engineering students in the future.

During car construction, problems were encountered with mounting wheel axles in a stable manner that produced as little friction as possible. Originally, eyehooks for this purpose, but students had trouble keeping eyehooks in place due to the strength of the motor. To circumvent this, officers devised the use of straws to contain the axles and restrict unwanted movement with little friction.

Overall, the project was a tremendous success. Students were engaged with the project and the presentations, and teams successfully produced solar-powered cars capable of movement. Participation was as expected and students were excited about the end results.
