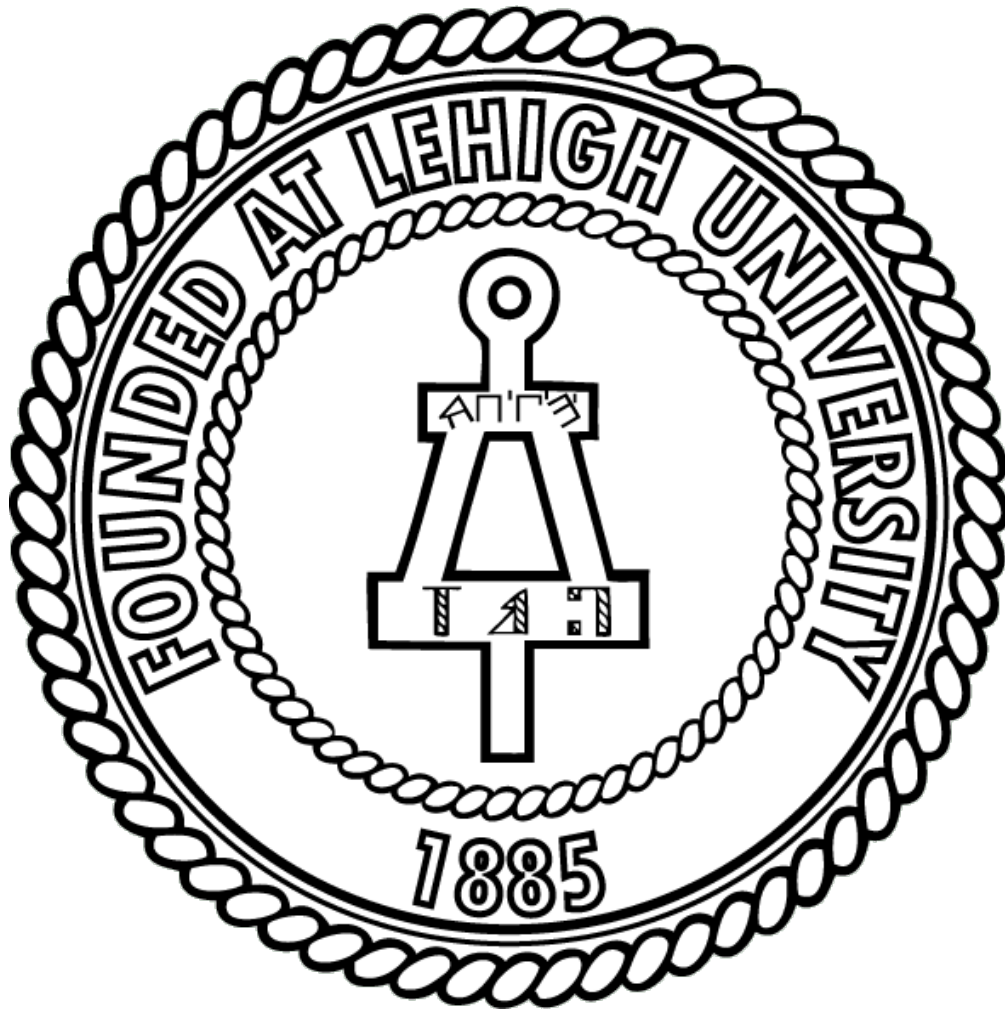

Fall 2019 to Spring 2020

Executive Summary

The Tau Beta Pi Texas Alpha Chapter at the University of Texas at Austin initiated 47 Tau Beta Pi candidates into our chapter during the 2019-2020 academic year. These members showed integrity and excellence in engineering through the completion of eighteen candidate requirements in tandem with maintenance of outstanding scholastic and extracurricular achievements. Some of those requirements include attending participating in seven chapter social events, completing six hours of community service with the chapter, contributing four hour to internal chapter activities like fundraising, and attending at least one professional event such as a fireside hosted by a distinguished faculty member in the Cockrell School of Engineering. This chapter report contains a summary of all 90 events sponsored by our chapter that our candidates participated in.

Our diligent, semester long initiation process is designed to ensure that our candidates are honorable engineers and not just high-GPA students. The social events provide opportunities for our candidates to develop connections with other high-achieving Cockrell School of Engineering students in the Texas Alpha chapter from other departments, allowing for relationships that might not have otherwise been formed. Firesides allowed those candidates to connect with, glean valuable insights from and obtain career advice from professors outside a traditional academic setting. In addition, our candidates are divided into four families along with participating active members and officers. This provides them with a chance to form closer bonds and become invited into a more intimate TBP family. Each family also plans their own socials, provides a more accessible support system for the candidates and is always a success.

Furthermore, our most committed, emphasized and important requirement is the fulfillment of at least six hours of community service. Although six hours does not seem substantive, it can become a challenge as our candidates learn to balance TBP activities and their engineering course load during the initiation process. The goal of the community service hours is to motivate our candidates to help the community we all live in, whether it is helping to feed and interact with homeless people, cleaning up our local parks, or writing letters to the elderly during a pandemic. In addition, all candidates are broken into teams to set up their own community service projects. As evidenced from the events put together during both the fall and spring semester, our chapter can already see improvements in our service requirement. In total, Texas Alpha candidates were supposed to complete 282 hours of community service hours, instead they put in nearly 200 hours towards the improvement of the Austin community, remarkable considering the strains that COVID-19 placed on our chapter's ability to plan and execute service events.

A target for the Texas Alpha Chapter for the 2019-2020 year was to increase the involvement of the active members. To address this, the requirements for active members were increased to 12 points, including specifications for meeting, social, internal and service attendance. This change had an overall positive on the organization as a whole, with active members appreciating being more involved and candidates getting to meet more active members at events.

Another objective of the Texas Alpha Chapter for the 2019-2020 year was to improve upon the previous tradition of brown bag lunches. This previous tradition was a requirement for candidates and included a candidate having a coordinated lunch, meeting or hangout with an officer or active member. A frequent objection to this tradition included a lack of continued

relationship between the candidate and the active member, and so our chapter developed a Big/Little system for the Spring 2020 semester. In this system, the officers paired each incoming candidate with a willing active or officer for the semester and encouraged the pair to attend events together and even plan their own socials. To facilitate this relationship, our chapter required each Big/Little pair to attend two events together and provide a picture together as evidence. This system received very positive feedback from all participants, as the candidates felt like they were able to form a close, reliable relationship with a current member of TBP and were more confident attending events knowing a friendly face would be there.

Texas Alpha experienced an unprecedented obstacle this spring semester – the COVID-19 pandemic and had to rapidly adjust to the stay-at-home guidelines. This change interrupted all of the event plans during the second half of the semester and accounts for the lack of service, internal and professional events. To accommodate for this, the officer team relaxed the point requirement for the candidate class as to not penalize them, as many of them had already completed the majority of their points. The chapter also had to come up with a completely new set of social and service events. These included online group games such as Skribblio and League of Legends and an impactful service project writing letters for elderly patients stuck in nursing homes. These new events were successful, with candidates and actives alike attending the social events and staying in touch with TBP members. Due to the large number of heavily involved seniors graduating this year, Texas Alpha also made sure to host a virtual end-of-semester banquet to honor both the candidates and seniors. Although the end-of-semester conditions were not ideal, our chapter was able to host a successful, virtual initiation and come together as an organization to support each other during this difficult time.

Although the next academic year is still uncertain, Texas Alpha strives to promote integrity and excellence in engineering by continuing to have a strict and rigorous initiation process. At the same time, we also try to increase active involvement by giving incentives to continue to participate in TBP events even after initiation. This year, we recognized several active Texas Alpha members who went above and beyond to contribute to the chapter's social and service activities throughout both semesters with banquet awards and scholarships. Our officer team and active members will continue to provide an inclusive environment for our membership to develop connections, build their professional experience and improve the local community through community service.
