

Dear Award Committee Members:

I highly recommend the Texas Beta Chapter for the R.H. Nagel Most Improved Chapter Award.

The progress they've made over the past few years should surprise many, but it especially has surprised me. When I became a District 13 Director in 2017, Texas Beta was unfortunately the chapter that gave me the most grief. They had had poor transitions for multiple years, and as a result their chapter had lost touch of even the most fundamental aspects of running the chapter. They were District 13's only chapter that year to hold an unapproved initiation as a result. In addition, they were suddenly faced with multiple other issues: the companies that had sponsored them in the past were no longer sending them the money they relied on, leading to significant financial issues. Initiation numbers were on the decline. Their events couldn't compete with other, better funded engineering clubs on campus.

Eric Fortier entered as President in the Fall of 2018 facing all of these issues and more. I distinctly remember meeting him in the summer as we both knew the chapter was facing the possibility of falling apart. I left that meeting with strong confidence that he'd be able to bring it back, and over the course of the year I was proved correct. The chapter had its most successful year in a very long time, initiating the most new members in years, holding more events, strengthening its finances, and reorganizing itself. Their success resulted in a Chapter Excellence Award with Distinction at the 2019 Convention.

Eric was followed by Eddy Mercedes this past year who has continued Eric's success and even surpassed it. Again, they've initiated more members than before, even despite the pandemic affecting their Spring initiation process. They were also able to elect their entire set of officers for this upcoming year all the way back in their Fall semester. The issues they faced previously with lack of continuity are completely gone. It's now one of the most successful large chapters in our district.

The most important point to understand about Texas Beta's success is that they've pulled it off with very little support. Their institution does not do nearly as much to help them as I've usually seen in other chapters. In fact, their university has made it increasingly difficult for them to even hold their initiation process. They lost their corporate sponsors. They face substantial competition from other, well-funded engineering organizations on campus. There are very few TBP alumni in their area. They are hours away from any major city. I am their closest District Director, and I'm still a five-and-a-half hour drive away. Despite all of these obstacles, they've made their own way, and I'm very proud of them for it.

I'm honored to nominate Texas Beta for this award, as I believe it would be a fitting reward for Eric Fortier, Eddy Mercedes, and all their fellow officers that put in the effort required to lift their chapter to where it is now.

Dear Award Committee Members:

I was initiated in the Fall of 2018; it was a new beginning for our chapter as we had fallen to one of the least compliant chapters in the nation. Eric Fortier, our president at the time, was seeking new officers to fill for the following year and I remember sitting there as no one wanted to take on any roles. He was desperate as all his hard work would not continue if there weren't any officers for the following year. I let him convince me to take the President role and it turned out to be one of the best decisions I ever made. My name is Eddy Mercedes and I am the outgoing president for the Texas Beta chapter, and I believe the work set forth by Eric Fortier our previous president and myself has made our chapter worthy of the R.H. Nagel Most Improved Chapter Award.

In 2018, Eric attended nationals as the President of our chapter. The award ceremony came, and every single chapter in our district received a chapter of excellence award except for us. A group picture was taken, and Eric was the only one without an award in his hand. For the rest of convention, Eric was reminded of our chapter's weak stance in our district. I have heard the story countless times, but it is a true testament of his leadership as from that day forward, this would all change. Eric took the chapter from what it was and quickly improved our campus recognition. We were able to initiate strong numbers and even held an Engineering Futures event that year, our first ever. We hosted plenty of events, restructured our finances and set the foundation for who we are today.

It was a completely different experience for me, and I have Eric Fortier to thank for that. Building on this foundation, we have continued our chapters growth hosting more events and improving our chapters engagement. We had our first contested officer election this year, and I was happy to see the desire of members to be in the officer board with four members running for President. Our community has grown from one that was struggling to stay alive, to one that has beyond exceeded expectations. We initiated a record high class in the Fall of 2019 and even with Covid hindering our Spring semester, managed to keep our numbers high. At the 2019 Convention I had the privilege to accept The Chapter of Excellence Award with Distinction on behalf of our chapter.

The foundation has been set, and although it wasn't easy, I am confident our chapter is headed in the right direction. I had the amazing privilege of leading such an amazing group of officers and am excited to see where this will take us. I have decided to stay active as an advisor to our chapter and would love to see what our new President, Michael Stewart, has in store for us.
